This program will trace the history and development of the song from conception in September 1966 through commercial release in February 1967.

The Music of *Star Wars*: A Look at John Williams' Orchestral Scores Often called a "space opera", one aspect of the *Star Wars* films that helped make them such a success was composer John Williams' ultra-romantic orchestral score. This 90-minute program will showcase the music of all six movies, citing historical precedents and comparing musical influences with the twofold purpose of (1) illustrating how the music developed, and (2) enlightening listening and furthering enjoyment of the music.

This 60-minute program will trace the development of Rock 'n' Roll (as distinct from Rock of the 1960's) from its roots in the blues and country music, through its pinnacle in the mid 1950's, and its abrupt decline in the late 50's. Artists discussed will include Carl Perkins, Buddy Holly, Little Richard, Chuck Berry, and Elvis Presley, among others.
